



Weekly Update

We need your help!!! For over a decade, Baldwin has received Federal Title 1 dollars. This year Title 1 pays for 6 teaching positions, academic paraprofessionals, tutoring, copy paper, classroom novels, technology & instructional materials. Next year, we are going to lose our Title 1 funding unless we have more families apply and qualify for Free or Reduced lunch.

We are currently at 43% of our students. The threshold is 50%. This is not just about students getting free or reduced lunch. If we lose Title 1 dollars, we will lose additional teaching positions. This will immediately impact our class sizes and our academic programs. If you have not yet this year, please stop and apply now using the QR Code. Also, if you applied earlier in the year but things changed with you financially, please reapply.

Please see the next slide on McKinney Vento situations. MANY of our families qualify automatically for Free or Reduced lunch, but they do not understand that they are in a McKenney Vento situation. We have until February 6th to find 100 students that have applied and qualify for Free or Reduced lunch. I know you are busy, but please help us maintain these dollars for 2026-2027.

All McKinney-Vento students qualify for free and reduced lunch. One of the following criteria must be met to qualify for McKinney-Vento:

- **children and youths who are sharing the housing of other persons (i.e. living in a rental or home NOT in their parent's name) due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason**; are living in motels hotels, RV trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative accommodations; are living in emergency or transitional shelters; are abandoned in hospitals
- children and youths who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings
- children and youths who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings;
- migratory children who qualify as homeless for the purposes of this subtitle because the children are living in circumstances described in clauses (1) through(3).
- **An unaccompanied youth who is not in the physical custody of a biological parent or legal guardian.**

Todos los estudiantes dentro de la categoría McKinney-Vento califican para almuerzos gratuitos y a precio reducido. Debes cumplir con uno de los siguientes criterios para calificar como McKinney-Vento:

- Niños y jóvenes que comparten la vivienda de otras personas debido a la pérdida de vivienda, dificultades económicas o una razón similar; que viven en moteles, hoteles, parques de casas rodantes o campamentos debido a la falta de alojamiento alternativos; que viven en refugios de emergencia o de transición; que están abandonados en hospitales.
- Niños y jóvenes cuya residencia principal nocturna es un lugar público o privado que no está diseñado ni se utiliza normalmente como alojamiento regular para dormir.
- Niños y jóvenes que viven en automóviles, parques, espacios públicos, edificios abandonados, viviendas inadecuadas, estaciones de autobús o tren, o entornos similares.
- Niños migrantes que califican como personas sin hogar a efectos de este subtítulo porque están viviendo en circunstancias descritas en los apartados (1) a (3).
- Un joven no acompañado que no esté bajo la custodia física de un padre biológico o tutor legal.

In Florida, the DMV links truancy to driving privileges. We have had several students lose their license recently for chronic absenteeism.

Key Truancy Triggers & Consequences

- **Trigger:** 15 unexcused absences in 90 calendar days for students 14 and older.
- **School Action:** Reports the student to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV).
- **DHSMV Action (Licensed Teens):** Driving privilege suspended.
- **DHSMV Action (Unlicensed Teens):** Ineligible to apply for a license.
- **Reinstatement/Eligibility:** Requires proof of 30 consecutive days of school attendance or graduation.

Never let your emotion control you



- Stop the impulse to react, take deep breaths, then decide how to proceed calmly.
- Labeling emotions helps reduce their intensity.
- Acknowledge emotions as natural human experiences rather than fighting them.
- Focus on the present moment and observe your emotions and physical sensations without judgment.
- Express your emotions healthily by Talk about feelings, journal, cry, or engage in creative outlets like art.
