


ESPAÑOL

All McKinney-Vento students qualify for free and reduced lunch. One of the following criteria must be met to qualify for McKinney-Vento:

- **children and youths who are sharing the housing of other persons (i.e. living in a rental or home NOT in their parent's name) due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason**; are living in motels hotels, RV trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative accommodations; are living in emergency or transitional shelters; are abandoned in hospitals
- children and youths who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings
- children and youths who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings;
- migratory children who qualify as homeless for the purposes of this subtitle because the children are living in circumstances described in clauses (1) through(3).
- **An unaccompanied youth who is not in the physical custody of a biological parent or legal guardian.**


Celebrations





In Florida, the DMV links truancy to driving privileges. We have had several students lose their license recently for chronic absenteeism.

Key Truancy Triggers & Consequences

- **Trigger:** 15 unexcused absences in 90 calendar days for students 14 and older.
- **School Action:** Reports the student to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV).
- **DHSMV Action (Licensed Teens):** Driving privilege suspended.
- **DHSMV Action (Unlicensed Teens):** Ineligible to apply for a license.
- **Reinstatement/Eligibility:** Requires proof of 30 consecutive days of school attendance or graduation.
